Letter from the Interim Senior Pastor

Dear Avondale Family,

Here we are at the beginning of a new year. It is 2018 and I am sure there are many exciting and wonderful things awaiting our future. However, I think it would be noteworthy to begin by taking a look back.



The year 2017 was certainly full of many blessings but also many changes for Avondale. And I believe it is fair to say, we are still reeling from some of the events of 2017. First of all, we have been worshipping in the Family Life Center and though I believe God can show up anywhere, for some of us, moving from the sanctuary was painful. With the change of location, there were other changes as well. The two previous services were combined into one blended service. This meant a change in music, worship style, and new surroundings. A loss of familiarity was felt by the entire membership. Change happened for everyone. And yet, we have managed to worship together, serving the Lord with joy. No one can say Avondale is not adaptable. And that is a great quality to have.

Not everyone is able to overcome challenges like these but God is seeing Avondale through this transition. Last year, we retired several ministries that were loved by many in our membership. Change is hard for nearly everyone, but change can also be necessary, important and even fun if we change our perspective. Retiring beloved ministries has made way for new ministries to take seed.

Avondale took note that change was happening in the surrounding neighborhood and wanted to address the need it saw to reach out and build positive relationships with those who lived nearby but were not a part of our church. This gave way to a ministry involving the Bethlehem Center that is now known as the Avondale - Bethlehem Center (ABC) Ministry. We now house the teen center in the Family Life Center. We

strive to continue to build bridges and deepen relationships with Brookhill Village and Southside Homes, our friends and neighbors.

If all that change were not enough, we said goodbye to a dear and beloved pastor of thirty years in Rev. Dr. John Earl. In the midst of so much change saying goodbye to a man of God who led this church was difficult and heartbreaking. But we praise God for what God has done in John Earl's life and ministry. We are thankful that he led this church with faith and joy for so long.

We hired Rev. Veronica E. Cannon as our transitional pastor to lead us through all this change as we begin the task of seeking a new pastor. With her addition to the staff, we have been able to stay on task and keep the church moving forward.

Now we are taking a look to the future and I believe it is as bright as ever. Are there challenges? Yes. But we will overcome them together. Later this year, we will be electing a Pastor Nominating Committee to begin the search for our next pastor. And we will carry on with all of the active ministries in our church.

"ODD" Youth Fellowship

"ODD" Youth Fellowship had an amazing 2017 and we look forward to where God is leading for 2018!

Last year's highlights:

- Summer Trips!!!! Summer Trips!!!! Took
 large groups to Charleston, South Carolina for combined work camp, as
 well as larger group to Montreat (senior high) and Massanetta (middle
 school).
- Changed our small group program to include faith stories and sharing from members of the congregation on a monthly basis; this has been amazing! Each month, a church member attends our Sunday evening youth fellowship and shares their personal story of faith. This person is then "interviewed" by the youth and youth leaders. Then, in small groups, youth pull questions, interesting phrases, and powerful discussion points from the notes they took during the testimony. Youth leadership helps the youth to identify themes and lessons in Scripture that "fit" each faith story. The material is formed into a lesson plan that youth use as small group guides for the remainder of the month. This has been a wonderful addition in two ways: it has given an opportunity for church members to interact with and share faith stories with youth, and also, it has provided youth with a tremendous amount of ownership in their Sunday agenda.

What's ahead in 2018:

This summer, we head back to Charleston, South Carolina for our combined middle/high school work camp. We will also attend Montreat (senior high conference) and Massanetta (middle school conference). We have a Confirmation Class of seven youth along with seven mentors from the congregation.

CONNECT Camps

Avondale is proud to host CONNECT Camps - youth groups visiting Charlotte for mission and work trips. We provide facilities and organize

mission projects of varying types serving the Charlotte community. We provide year-round and weekend opportunities for churches and student groups, both local and out of the Charlotte area, to stay in Charlotte and serve others.

Avondale Basketball

Avondale participates in the Playbook for Life Ministries League. Last year's highlights:

- After a strong first year, Mr. Zachary Barjona has "taken the reins" and is now in full command of Avondale basketball. He has continued to build strong relationships with players, coaches and visitors on game day. He has made himself available to players, parents and coaches in a variety of ways. He visits practices and encourages everyone to give their best effort and to be kind in all they do.
- We have 15 teams with over 120 players/coaches in total.

What's ahead in 2018:

Mr. Barjona is continuing to work on a more constructive and achievable way to integrate faith and theology into basketball ministry. We

will be working on a season-end mission project for all of Avondale's teams. In previous years, we have hosted a banquet for players, families and coaches at season's end. Leadership has decided that a large-scale and enthusiastic mission project involving all Avondale Basketball participants is a valuable innovation and much needed addition to the program.

Discipleship

Discipleship Gathering Group

The Discipleship Gathering Group finds ways to grow our faith by encouraging people to grapple with God's call on our lives, strengthening relationships among those in and outside of our congregation, and preparing us to be good stewards of our time, talents, and resources. In 2017, we consisted of three elders, a member of clergy, and the team leaders of Member Care, Stewardship, Congregational Life, and Christian Nurture.

Helping to build a relationship between Avondale members and residents of the Southside and Brookhill neighborhoods was one of our areas of focus this year. Here are how our teams responded to that, as well as a look at achievements and challenges throughout the year:

Congregational Life

One of the year's most fun and meaningful fellowship activities was the outing to the Knights game in May and the tailgate beforehand. We had a good turnout and it was split evenly between Avondale members and those families with children attending the Bethlehem Center. The Avondale Fall Festival didn't draw many Avondale members, but did attract a substantial number of people from the surrounding neighborhoods. Christian Nurture

Two Christian education classes decided to make moves that made for some meaningful growth and transformation. Jovful Noise, a class for mothers and their babies and toddlers, has flourished, so much so it needed a dedicated space. The Aitken and Vanguard Sunday school classes decided to combine, freeing up a room for them. Vacation Bible School attracted 43 children this summer and Avondale Adventures also had strong attendance. The 10-week program, which concluded with a Christmas musical, was a success with the help of several people who stepped up to lead, including the youth. The youth led the congregation in a meaningful worship service in the spring. The Youth Council organized mission trips and their weekly Sunday evening programs. Sunday school classes for all ages continue, although participation has continued to decrease. The team is looking for additional ways for members to nurture and explore their faith. One of them last year included bringing a series of speakers to Avondale to help prepare the congregation for its work with the Southside and Brookhill communities. Christian Nurture worked with the Come to the Table team on this. A good portion of the congregation attended the sessions which focused on matters involving race and poverty. They also attracted many from outside Avondale. Member Care

The team continued to reach out to members in need of care this year. Its volunteers visited shut-ins, provided meals to those who were recently hospitalized, families of new babies, and to families on the day of a funeral. We rejoiced in the births of three new babies born in 2017 (Joshua Finn Sutherland, Kellen James Pavlin and Sage Frost Wright). We mourn for the seven members who died this year (Al Weigle, Jim Rogers, Edna Hilton, Mike Cathey, Betty Marvin, Jim Singer and Bill Parrish). We celebrated when seven youth members joined our congregation in 2017.

Stewardship

The team led a concerted push this year to inform the congregation of

Mission

ABC Team

In a year that opened with the joyful relocation of the Bethlehem Center Out-of-School Time (OST) Teen Center to the Avondale campus and closed with the Christmas Dinner Angel Tree celebration and fellowship shared by Avondale and Bethlehem Center families, the partnership between our communities began to open doors for relationship building and the nurture of children and families. Volunteer and mentoring opportunities are blossoming as well as fellowship events like the Knights baseball game and picnic and the Fall Festival. Vision work continues with discussion of adding an elementary after-school

classroom and possibilities to partner in the Avondale Adventures program to grow faith in children. [ABC Ministry full report on p. 35.] Gratitude is expressed to Robert Suydam, Ann Sanders and Patti Oswald for their faithful leadership.

Bridge Team

Since its September 2017 inception, the Avondale members of the Bridge Team have been working with partners at South Tryon Community Church, residents in the Brookhill and Southside Homes neighborhoods, and Myers Park United Methodist Church. With the vision of developing bridge building activities between the communities, the team is engaging community leaders as partners in identifying community needs and what type of focused activities, events, and programs are most beneficial to the communities. Several ideas have already come to fruition including a Christmas dinner and gift exchange for some of our friends at South Tryon UMC, an Avondale Advent offering that supplied toiletries for their Winter Shelter, and preliminary plans for an upcoming Health Fair in the heart of Southside and Brookhill. Gratitude is expressed to Avondale members serving on the Bridge Team and to Chris Lee for his leadership in bringing community partners to the table.

Room In The Inn

As a community of faith, Avondale continues to meet immediate needs in our community by answering the call to provide shelter for 12 people on an unbearably frigid New Year's Eve. Over the course of eight more cold nights, we supported Urban Ministry's RITI program that houses neighbors experiencing homelessness by opening our doors and our hearts to 96 men, women and children. Transportation, three meals daily, clean beds, and a safe welcoming place to rest were our privilege to share with neighbors living on the margins.

Gratitude is expressed to Jim McCarthy and Robert Suydam for their compassionate leadership in 2017 and willingness to lead 2018 along with Laura Meier.

Face to Face in Milot Haiti

Our connection to Milot, Haiti continues to deepen and evolve. We are grateful for the journey and for the leading of the Spirit that carried us

to Milot to feed the hungry. Vision work continues as to how best to partner with our Haitian friends with much promise found in supporting the building of a Mission House in that community. Corey Shanks, Ted Todd, Debby Sacra, and the Zuyus family traveled to Milot in October 2017 to explore how we might best work with our friends to fund and build a structure that can house mission workers, create an income stream and jobs, and lead to many possibilities as a community gathering place. Plans are in place to share their discoveries and stories of spiritual transformation with the Avondale congregation in early 2018.

CONNECT Camps

Thoughtful stewardship in the use of our facilities allows Avondale to host college students, youth and adults from around the country who come to Charlotte to build the Kingdom. Members prepared and served dinner to several visiting CONNECT Camps. Plans are moving forward to establish an advisory board to seek paths to enhance the faith experience for our guests while visiting our campus.

Giving Garden

Welcoming gardeners from beyond our walls, Avondale successfully launched a 17 plot community garden format on our campus in March 2017. A shared appreciation for the wonder and truth of God's creation fostered fellowship in a therapeutic natural setting. Four plots benefiting Friendship Trays enabled us to donate over 550 lbs. of fresh produce to homebound meals-on-wheels recipients.

Special Offerings

In 2017, Avondale continued a strong connection to the Presbyterian Church USA and Church worldwide through generous giving. Financial support of the Denomination totaled \$13,560 in addition to the Special Offerings that totaled \$18,562. Worship

Worship Gathering Group

Your worship committee was busy in 2017. Worship is an integral part of Avondale and who we are. As you recall, Avondale moved to one 9:30 worship service in the Family Life Center (FLC) on September 11, 2016. Much of the first part of 2017 was spent working to optimize worship in the FLC, worship that truly brings the best elements from each former worship service and unites them in our new service. Meshing two services into one has not been without some growing pains. Retaining Reformed worship as THE essential guide, we experimented with several possibilities and formats. You, the congregation were patient and provided formal and informal feedback to clergy and the Worship Team about what was working and what was not. Midyear we settled into a liturgy that has basic elements that continue and flexibilities within an outline. Regina Love and Rich Stanley worked closely together to choose hymns, responses and anthems that fit the theme of each week's worship and to find ways to make diverse music styles combine in the service of our worship. We've added "Commitment to Community" and monthly faith stories.

Worshipping in the FLC requires many gifts and Avondale is truly blessed to have faithful and talented members who help, from those

who serve by setting up chairs, video and sound systems, to setting up coffee/juice and embellishments that help define and enhance our worship space. Then there are greeters, ushers, liturgists/scripture readers. And, of course, we are grateful for the many musicians and musi-

cal groups who help energize our worship. There is a place for you to assist in worship, no matter your skill set and gifts.

Your Worship Team designed two Sunday music series that were held in the sanctuary this year, the first on the four Sundays of June and the second on two Sundays during Advent. We also used the sanctuary for services on Maundy Thursday and 11 PM Christmas Eve.

Management

Management Gathering Group

New in 2017, in order to create more avenues of support and communication, the Management Gathering group was formed. Bi-monthly, the Finance, Personnel and Property team leaders meet to share ideas and make sure we all are working towards the common goal as determined by the Session of the church.

Finance

The Finance Team had a busy year handling Avondale's day-to-day financial operations and navigating the evolving financial needs throughout 2017. Below are a few of the highlights for the year:

- Avondale began 2017 with a budget deficit and ended the year with a \$17,631 budget surplus. This favorable result stemmed from personnel expense savings attributable to John and Nadja's retirement, lower than projected expenses driven by responsible spending, and the dedicated support by Avondale's pledging members.
- Investment returns of 14% generated approximately \$15,000 on Avondale's operating reserves and \$108,000 for the Endowment. The Endowment targeted \$32,000 for 2017 and funded a \$1,500 room improvement for the Joyful Noise program and two new stoves for the Fellowship Hall. The Endowment has approximately \$32,000 available for distribution this year. Requests for distributions should be directed to the Finance Team.
- The 2017 Audit was completed affirming most of our procedures and recommended a number of improvements which are in the process of being communicated to the team leaders and implemented. The Avondale Children's Center also participated in this effort and will work with Avondale's leadership in the coming year to coordinate our common efforts.

Special thanks to Finance Team members Rogers McGee, Stewart Farris, Ryan Patterson, Jed Wilkerson, and Fred Wilkerson (Leader) for their dedication, to D. J. Saleeby and Tony McKenzie for managing the audit effort, and to Renita Fowler for being the backbone of Avondale's financial operations.

Personnel

This year was a busy year for the Personnel Team with many changes and milestones within the staff at Avondale. Here are a few highlights.

- Conducted staff annual reviews and adjusted job descriptions as needed.
- Celebrated the 5 year anniversary of Rev. Chris Lee joining our staff.
- Received the resignation of John Earl and Nadja Sefcik-Earl after over 30 years of service.

- Planned extensive celebrations to congratulate John and Nadja as they move on to different phases of their lives. We continue to say "Well done, good and faithful servants."
- Welcomed Rev. Veronica Cannon to serve as our Interim Pastor.

Appreciation is extended to members of the team for their faithful service this year. Team members included: Kay Chelena, Debi Medlin, Lynn Daniel, Zach Chambers and Bruce Vestal (Leader).

Property

The age of our buildings, and the care they require, is always a large task. In addition to the standard maintenance projects, the Property Committee also completed these tasks:

- Removed the large tree from the center of the Sacred Garden which had become dangerous due to rotten roots.
- Installed bike racks around the property to keep up with increased demand.
- Furnished the office to support staffing changes.
- Created a property issues log system that helps with day-to-day maintenance, making it easier to share and track the care of our buildings and property.
- Lead two congregation wide workdays to spruce up our property.

Music was intricately planned from the lectionary readings, and we had the joy of using our wealth of talent to bring these texts to life innovatively in the Family Life Center (FLC). John Earl prepared a special sermon series leading up to his retirement. Several "Music in the Sanctuary" performances were held in the summer, and we had Maundy Thursday and Christmas Eve in the memorable venue.

The Music Staff and Worship Gathering members were asked by Session to create a vision for the music program. We, first of all, documented the long history of musical excellence at Avondale. We acknowledged our current musicians and their successful efforts in creating meaningful music for worship as converged. We looked ahead to see what an expanded youth and outreach program may entail. We recognized that permanent worship space that is acoustically sound and self reliant is imperative for the coming years. We look forward to the journey.

I am reminded every Sunday of the resources Avondale has as a family and the fact that we have made the past year successful in our

endeavors to further the Kingdom.

Interim Pastor Search

Pastor Search

After John Earl gave notice to the Session of his impending retirement, one of the first orders of business for our Church was the formation of an Interim Pastor Search Committee. Dr. Earl's hope was that an interim minister would be in place by the time of his September 3rd departure. The Session approved a committee consisting of John Magee, Barbara Darling, Betty Boyd, Rich Worf, Lynn Wilkerson, and Bill Caldwell. This was uncharted territory for this committee, as Avondale had not had an interim search committee in 30 years and the process had changed significantly during the past three decades.

As Avondale geared up to celebrate Dr. Earl's 30 years at Avondale, the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry appointed a liaison to the Avondale Interim Search Committee. The Committee spent two meetings with the liaison, learning the in's and out's of the orderly Presbyterian process that governs this search. The liaison continued as a consultant to our committee as we developed and edited interview questions and then began the work of finding individuals trained as interim pastors who were available. Unlike searching for a permanent minister, there is no single repository for those ministers who have completed the interim pastor training and who are seeking an interim position.

After reading packets from a number of individuals and interviewing three others, the Committee was led to Rev. Veronica Cannon. When the interview with Rev. Cannon was completed, the committee imme-

diately knew that she was the right person for Avondale. The Committee was of one mind, an unusual occurrence for this collegial group.

Rev. Cannon joined us in late October 2017. During the time between when Dr. Earl left and Rev. Cannon began, Avondale was ably served by Rev. Chris Lee and a guest minister.

Notes to Financial Information

Accounting Change: Adding a Prepaid Pledge Liability

Avondale follows commonly accepted accounting rules to accurately record revenue and expenses. This report on the opposite page records revenue when received and expenses when paid. This is known as cash basis accounting. Avondale's expenses exceeded our revenue by \$19,840 from January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017 resulting in a loss for the year. However, the Finance Team's Annual Report highlights state that 2017 ended in a gain of \$17,631.

Why is there a discrepancy?

In 2016, Avondale received Prepaid Pledges of \$37,471 from members intended to be applied in 2017. Using cash basis accounting we recorded these Prepaid Pledges as Member Pledges (i.e. included in Contributions figure) in that year which overstated the Member Pledges intending to support the 2016 budget. To eliminate confusion and to allocate Member Pledges to the year they will be applied, we are going to change the way we record Prepaid Pledges. Instead of adding the prepaid pledges to the revenue in the year received, we will create a liability account on Avondale's balance sheet titled Prepaid Pledge Liability. This will reallocate the Prepaid Pledges to the year the funds will be used. On January 1st, Prepaid Pledges will be removed from the balance sheet and added to Member Pledges. This change will more accurately portray the flow of Avondale's revenue and expenses. If we reallocate the 2016 Prepaid Pledges of \$37,471 to the 2017 Member Pledges the \$19,840 loss becomes a \$17,631 gain (i.e. \$37,471 -\$19,840).

In 2018, the Finance Team will make this accounting change. In December 2017, Avondale received Prepaid Pledges of \$53,361 which were recorded as Prepaid Pledge Liability. On January 1, 2018, the Prepaid Pledges were added to the Member Pledge total supporting the 2018 budget.

Annual Report 2017 - Avondale Bethlehem Center (ABC) Ministry

The Avondale Bethlehem Center (ABC) Ministry was formed in 2017 – the result of three years of spirit-guided work done by the Session, the Dream Team and the Implementation Team. The 2017 year brought many shared joys and opportunities.

The Vision

As a reminder, leadership established a clear vision to connect with the Southside/Brookhill neighborhood, build bridges to our neighbors in these communities, and work toward fulfilling our strategic objectives. These objectives include serving our neighbors and knowing them personally, preparing the hearts of children and families to abide in Christ, and reducing economic inequities by breaking down barriers to education. This vision culminated in a partnership agreement between Avondale and the Bethlehem Center (BC) of Charlotte.

Bethlehem Center Out of School Time (OST) Enrichment Program:

School Year: M -- F 2:00 p.m. - 6:30 p.m.; Summer Camp: M - F 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.

In April this program relocated from cramped quarters in the BC main campus to Avondale's Family Life Center and youth rooms. On Easter Sunday the BC Teen Center was dedicated during worship, including tours of the redesigned space. The OST program at Avondale started with 8 teens; this number increased to 18 middleschoolers and teens when the OST transitioned from the school year to Summer Camp in June. The OST features educational projects, tu-

toring, homework help, field trips and college tours for the youth enrolled.

A highlight for ABC was the OST End of Summer Showcase in August, during which BC children and vouth demonstrated areas of learning and recapped summer camp activities - for parents, families, and Avondale members. Getting to Know Our Neighbors through Shared Activities and Volunteering

On Sunday, May 7 Avondalers joined with BC families to enjoy a tailgate lunch and a Knights game. What a wonderful way to kick-off our relationship and get to know one another!
