Endowment Builders Must Have Known...

Over the last few years Avondale has seen a great deal of change. Some call them challenges while others will think of the opportunities before us.

Through this period Avondale has been able to successfully navigate an eventful financial journey. This year the roof on the FLC was replaced, significant HVAC repairs were necessary, and a variety of other property improvements were made for a total expenditure of roughly \$78,000. The Facility Fund, which has been created through member contributions over the years, made these capital improvements possible. They faithfully contribute simply knowing that the funds would be needed someday for the upkeep of our facilities important to us all.

The Bearden Family made an estate bequest to provide financial support the consideration of a new or renovated sanctuary. This fund has been used to fund the Sacred Space Committee's effort. The balance of the Bearden Fund will be exhausted in early 2020 but the Bearden's support beyond their lifetimes was a testament to their faith in both God and Avondale. They had faith in Avondale and trusted the future leadership to make good use of this resource. Their legacy will live on.

Over the last 20 years, the generous giving by Avondale members has seen the Golden Anniversary Endowment Fund grow to \$783,132. To date, the investment return has added another \$283,049 to the Endowment's balance. This fund, plus the restricted funds like the Facilities and the Bearden Fund, empowers Avondale to dream and serves as a buffer in chal-

lenging financial times. Without these funds, this year's projected deficit budgets and capital spending would significantly limit Avondale's capacity to serve.

So, did the donors to the Endowment know that Avondale would need the money they most generously gave

to Avondale? Sure they did. These faithful donors had the wisdom to know there would be both challenging times and times rich with opportunity for Avondale that would require financial support. A heart felt thank you!!!

Jim's Thanksgiving sermon was right on point. The Financial Ministry Team and the Session will continue to diligently monitor Avondale's financial situation; but we all need to remember to be thankful for our many blessings.

what is a refugee?

According to the United Nations, "A refugee is someone who has been forced to flee his or her country because of persecution, war, or violence. A refugee has a well-founded fear of persecution for reasons of race, religion, nationality, political opinion or membership in a particular social group. Most likely, they cannot return home or are afraid to do so. War and ethnic, tribal and religious violence are leading causes of refugees fleeing their countries."

Earlier this year, the youth of Avondale asked this very question. Our youth leadership contacted the Carolina Refugee Resettlement Agency. The director came to a youth meeting and spoke with us about the process of becoming a refugee and what it is like to be a refugee and resettling in a city like Charlotte. The agency works directly with the State Department to place families in housing, jobs, schools and to build roots in our community.

I think we came away from that discussion a little shocked and a little inspired. So naturally we asked, *"How can we help?"*

When a family is resettled, the State Department gives them a small stipend for 3 months that helps them during the time of transitions. One



way the CRRA helps, is with collecting donations to help make that money go further. For instance, if the family does not have to buy furniture, their money may be able to pay for an extra month of rent as they get settled into their new job.

Fall Mission Trip

Last month, 17 Avondalers headed three hours east of Charlotte on a weekend mission trip (many call it a work camp). We worked with a well-organized group in Whiteville that is helping with relief from hurricanes in the Whiteville area. Ages ranged from teen-agers to, um, several decades past teen-agers.

Our task was to replace the floor of a large mobile home flooded by Hurricane Florence last year. So we yanked out old boards, swept the floor, measured for new boards, sawed new boards, swept the floor (again), installed laminate flooring, swept the floor (yep, again), and hammered boards. We learned new skills, taught each other, laughed a lot, and ate a lot more.

The mission team hopes to schedule another weekend trip to work on hurricanedamaged homes in the spring. All skill levels are welcome, and all skill levels are needed. Watch for details next year!

Our Room In The Inn winter shelter ministry begins Sunday, December 1 and runs for 18 Sundays this winter. We need many hands as we provide safe shelter, warm meals, and fellowship for our neighbors struggling with homelessness during the coldest months of the year.

Avondale welcomes 10-15 overnight guests every Sunday night from December through March. These men, women and children who are experiencing homelessness are pickedup from Urban Ministry and transported to our campus. They receive a hot, nourishing meal, have opportunity to shower, are provided with a safe place to sleep, and are given breakfast and a sack lunch before being transported back to Urban Ministry.

With the merger of the Urban Ministry Center and the Men's Shelter this year, and the continued problems relating to affordable housing in Charlotte, we expect the need this year to be greater than ever for Room In The Inn. We need people to help with:

 Pick-up neighbors from Urban Ministry Center, or return them the next morning. This is very easy if you can drive the bus!
 Serve as overnight hosts. This job is easier than you think! It mainly involves getting to know our guests, making sure they have everything they need, and helping with laundry. Neighbors leave our campus by 6:30 AM, leaving plenty of time to get to work!
 Serve as evening hosts. Essentially the same as overnight hosts, except you don't spend the night.

4. Prepare dinner. This is a fun way to serve our neighbors, and a great option for kids to help out!
5. Prepare bagged lunches. We give each of our neighbors a bagged lunch when they leave us on Monday.
6. Prepare breakfast. We give our neigh-
